## Human Rights Doctoral and Early Career Research Associates Further Particulars

The Human Rights Consortium's Doctoral and Early Career Research Associates Network provides a forum for UK-based early career researchers in the field of human rights to come together in order to build contacts, develop collaborations and deepen their engagement with human rights research in an interdisciplinary context.

### Benefits

- Doctoral and Early Career Research Associates (DECRA) must be UK-based scholars. DECRA will gain access to an active, prestigious network of early-career scholars, enabling them to stay up-to-date with new developments and research trends in their field of study and to facilitate academic collaboration;
- DECRA will have the opportunity to contribute to, facilitate and convene high-level academic events and publications, enhancing their academic credentials at an early stage in their career.

### Criteria

- Members of the Doctoral and Early Career Research Associates network must have, or must be working towards, a PhD from a recognized University, or alternatively must have equivalent research experience in a professional capacity.
- If an applicant has already received their PhD, they must have received it within the last three years prior to their application. For applicants whose PhD was awarded more than three years ago, the Research Associates network is open for applications.

### Conditions

- Terms of membership in the Doctoral and Early Career Research Associates network are three years in the first instance and are subject to renewal.
- Doctoral and Early Career Research Associates are expected to contribute to the intellectual life of the network and are expected to attend at least one meeting and one PhD Research Students' conference (as speaker, chair or attendee) per academic year.
- DECRA are encouraged to take the lead on initiating events and projects within the Human Rights Consortium.
- Please note that membership of the DECRA network will not entitle members to automatic membership of the Human Rights Research Associates Network and that a separate application process will continue to apply.

- Please note that no stipend or any other payment or funding is associated with membership of the Research Associates Network.

### **Application Process**
